(January 31, 2024) — The International Literacy Association (ILA) announced today that The University of Texas at Tyler (UT Tyler) has been honored with ILA National Recognition, an academic honor highlighting teacher preparation programs that are among the best in the United States—which signifies that graduates from these programs are well-equipped to tackle today's challenges in literacy education.
