ILA ANNOUNCES ITS 2023 GLOBAL LIST OF 30 UNDER 30 LITERACY LEADERS

NEWARK, Del. (January 10, 2023) — The International Literacy Association (ILA) today unveiled its 2023 class of 30 Under 30 literacy leaders, a global group representing 15 countries that includes teachers, researchers, philanthropists, advocates and activists—all of whom share ILA's goal of literacy for every child, everywhere.

ILA's 30 Under 30 program launched in 2015 to spotlight rising visionaries in the literacy field who are affecting positive change in their classrooms and communities. The 2023 class joins a growing cohort of education leaders. Past honorees include Akash Patel, Spanish teacher and founder of Happy World Foundation; Allister Chang, founder of Civic Suds; and Shiza Shahid, cofounder of the Malala Fund.

"Each 30 Under 30 list allows us to share the inspiring stories of educators, administrators, librarians, authors, technology experts, nonprofit leaders, business leaders and advocates impacting the quality of literacy learning across the globe," says ILA Interim Executive Director Nicola Wedderburn. "These emerging leaders share ILA's mission of literacy for every child, everywhere. We look forward to continuing to partner with these honorees and following their important projects and work."

This year's list celebrates literacy advocates such as

- Ahmad Siyam Barakati, 25, the deputy director of Charmaghz in Kabul, Afghanistan, who
 campaigned to get their mobile libraries reopened (and the female staff back to work) after
 the Taliban regained control of the country
- Ashley Clerge, 28, a humanities teacher at Hugh Roe O'Donnell Elementary School in Massachusetts, U.S., whose social justice and advocacy units work to dismantle power dynamics in traditional classrooms and help fifth graders "become more curious about themselves and their place in society"
- Thanduxolo Mkoyi, 29, the director of Eyentsatshane for the Little Ones Early Childhood Development Project in Cape Town, South Africa, which uses the power of play, storytelling and literacy to improve education through story clubs and playgroups
